### UAE to boost homeland security spend to USD 10 billion in the next 10 years

The UAE is expected to raise spending on homeland security from the current USD 5.5 billion to USD 10 billion within the next 10 years.

New HLS investments being eyed in Abu Dhabi include the use of location-based services to protect critical infrastructure against criminal and terrorist threats by identifying intruders who enter high-security areas .

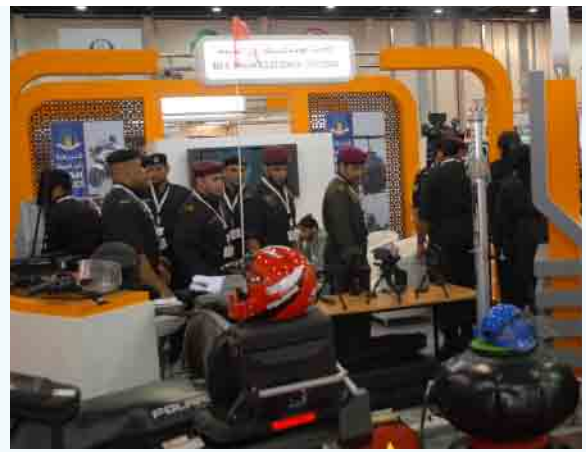
The Dubai Police has said that it will invest over USD 130 million to enhance video surveillance in sensitive areas and remove law enforcement blind spots.

The Emirates' security and emergency response authorities are currently reviewing the local and regional threat landscape and identifying areas of improvement in terms of policies, technologies and practices. ***Global military expenditure grew 1.3 per cent in real terms to USD 1.6 trillion in 2010***

Global military expenditure rose 1.3 per cent in real terms to more than USD 1.6 trillion in 2010 despite the ongoing economic downturn, affirming the sustained prioritization of security among the world's governments.

Given its vast oil resources, unique geography, and the spate of unrest it has witnessed over the past months, the Middle East will require more advanced homeland security (HLS) capabilities matching those already adopted in highly developed countries to face evolving local, regional and global threats.

Sophisticated HLS solutions are expected to comprise the bulk of the Middle East's USD 100 billion in defence spending through the next 4 years.



### Key government officials discuss regional & global importance of ISNR Abu Dhabi 2012

The Supreme Organizing Committee of the International Security and National Resilience (ISNR) Abu Dhabi Exhibition & Conference held a special press conference on October 12, 2011 at the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre to discuss the importance of the show as a global event focusing on the security challenges faced by the region. The conference was well-attended by the media, high-ranking government officials and key members of the private sector.

Among the speakers were Major General Mattar S. Bin Mesayed Al Neyadi, the General Director of the UAE Ministry of Interior's E-Services & Telecom division and the Chairman of the Supreme Organizing Committee; Major General Ahmed Nasir Al Raysi, Director of Central Operations at the Abu Dhabi Police and Vice Chairman of the Supreme Organizing Committee; and Brigadier Saeed Salem Al Hanki, Chief of the UAE Ministry of Interior's Police Judicial Council and Head of ISNR Abu Dhabi 2012's Scientific Committee; Staff Col. Pilot Salem Saeed Salem Al Sabousi, Executive Director of Operations at the Critical National Infrastructure Authority in Abu Dhabi; and Hamad Al Neyadi, Chief Strategy Officer of Tawazun Holding.

**Major General Mattar S. Bin Mesayed Al Neyadi** said that ISNR Abu Dhabi 2012 will consider the security issues faced by all segments of society, from government to the business community. He added that the participation of a huge number of companies specializing in local, regional and international security would bring in an unparalleled display of the latest equipment and technologies for security intelligence, threat assessment, border and transport security, counter-terrorism, the protection of critical facilities, crisis and disaster management, risk prevention, and emergency response.

The Chairman noted that the experiences to be shared by developed countries would greatly help the UAE in maintaining its high levels of security and stability, which he partly attributed to the wise leadership of H.H. Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, the President of the Emirates.

For his part, **Major General Ahmed Nasir Al Raysi** affirmed the Ministry of Interior's full support for ISNR AD 2012 under the directives of H.H. Sheikh Saif Bin Zayed Al Nahyan, UAE Minister of Interior and Deputy Prime Minister. Major General Raysi said that H.H. Al Nahyan views international fairs such as ISNR as important sources of security know-how and trends. He added that cross-border organized crime is a particular area of interest for the Ministry and that the event would offer solutions against the modern technology increasingly being used to commit such crimes.

Major General Al Raysi also pointed out that ISNR provides a good venue for exhibitors to take a look at the products of their competitors and find out how they can improve on their own solutions for the benefit of the whole security industry.

**Brigadier Saeed Salem Al Hanki** underscored the importance of security as a cornerstone for national stability in light of the evolution of crime. He called for more international cooperation and information exchange on emerging forms of criminality and how to effectively address them. He added that the Scientific Conference to be conducted as part of ISNR Abu Dhabi 2012 will facilitate focused discussions on how to enhance security systems at all levels.

The Brigadier pointed to intelligent systems, environmental terrorism, terrorism financing, and media's responsibilities in covering extremism among the event's interesting topics. He also said that ISNR Abu Dhabi 2012 would further motivate the UAE's security and emergency response agencies to modernize their operations and equipment and foster more cooperative relations between police and security departments.

**Fredric Theux**, President of Reed Exhibitions Middle East, the organizers of ISNR Abu Dhabi, also made important announcements during the press conference. He revealed that the Critical National Infrastructure Authority would be the event's partner for the third year in the row alongside Tawazun Holding, which will be debuting as strategic partner.

For 2012, Theux explained that ISNR Abu Dhabi will have a special focus on Fire and Rescue. He said that the UAE Civil Defence would conduct various outdoor live demonstrations never before seen together in the Emirates. This will include displays of helicopter rescue, off-road firefighting, aerial ladder platform – assisted response, and real-time life safety monitoring.

He added that the civil defence agency would unveil unique equipment acquired or co-developed by the UAE that would attract firefighters from across the region. This, he noted, comes at a time when Abu Dhabi and the UAE are making significant investments to develop state-of-the-art firefighting forces.

Theux added that Reed Exhibitions together with a delegation from the UAE Ministry of Interior were attending Millipol Paris, the world's largest event for homeland security, to bring in some of the best and latest technologies to Abu Dhabi. He also said that Reed Exhibitions team would be travelling to Turkey, South Africa and South Korea as part of efforts to actively promote ISNR Abu Dhabi 2012 to 22 additional countries around the world.
